This is the church of Bagsvaerd, a very unconventional building designed by Joern Utzon, known as the designer of the Sidney Opera house. It also acts as a community house with several audiences for lectures and chamber music.



This an aerial photo of the church. The church itself is situated under the highest part which also acts as bell tlower. The three compartments to the left are the auditories. Between them and the church there is a small atrium garden.



If you should not know what the Syudney Opera House looks like, here it is. It is the most well known building designed by Joern Utzon. Because of his fame a lot of architects and other interested people come every day to have a look at Bagsvaerd church.


